

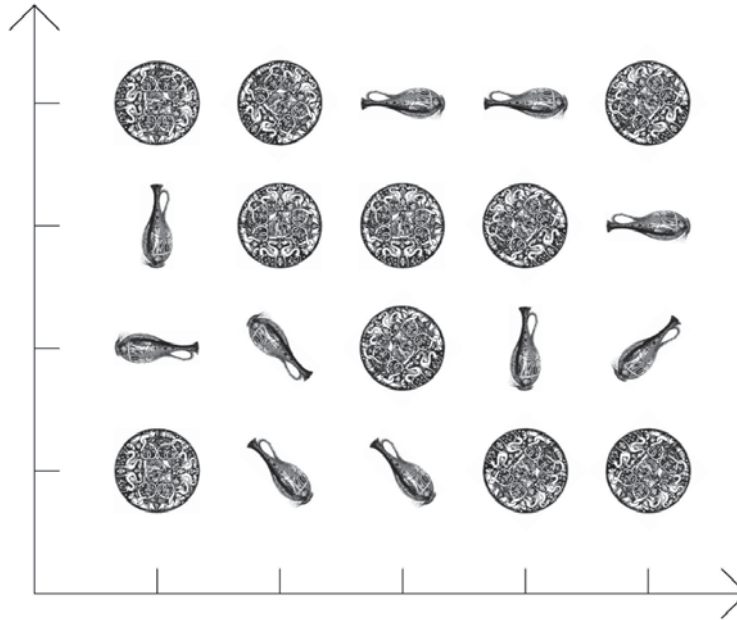


The Mausoleum at Halicarnassus

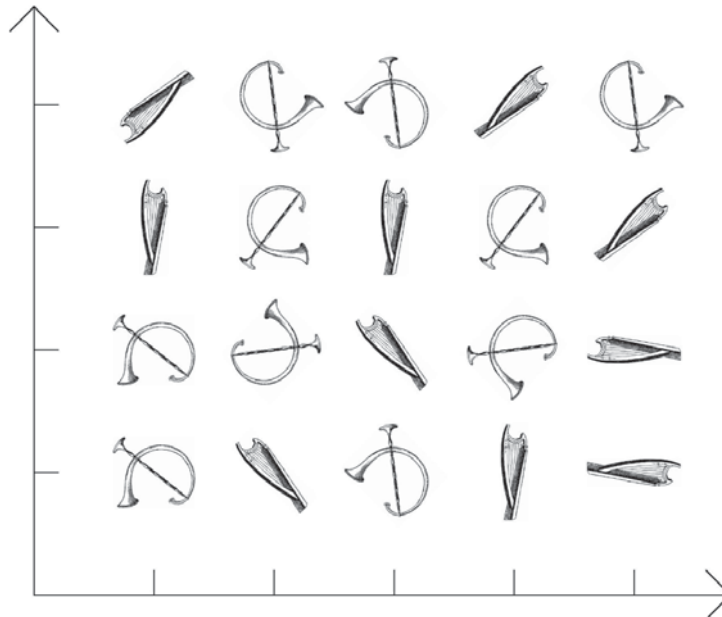

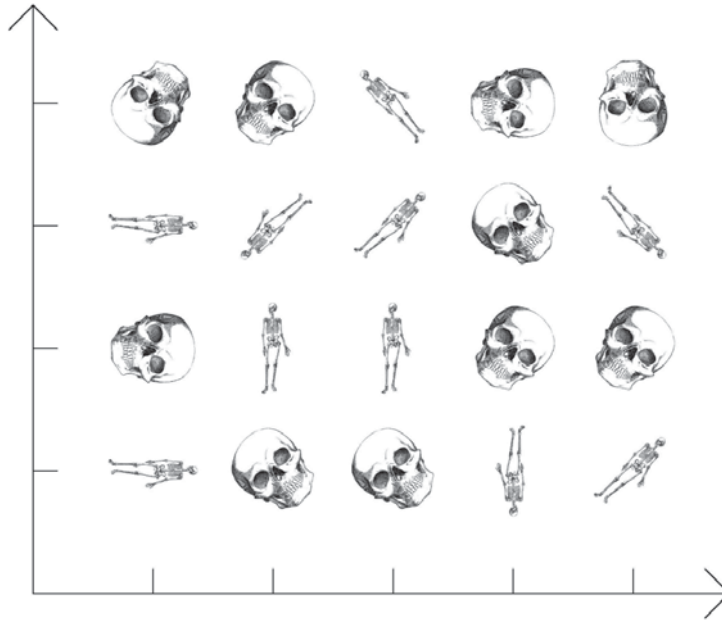
Dr. Ben Isaac Nary's Log - Entrance Room

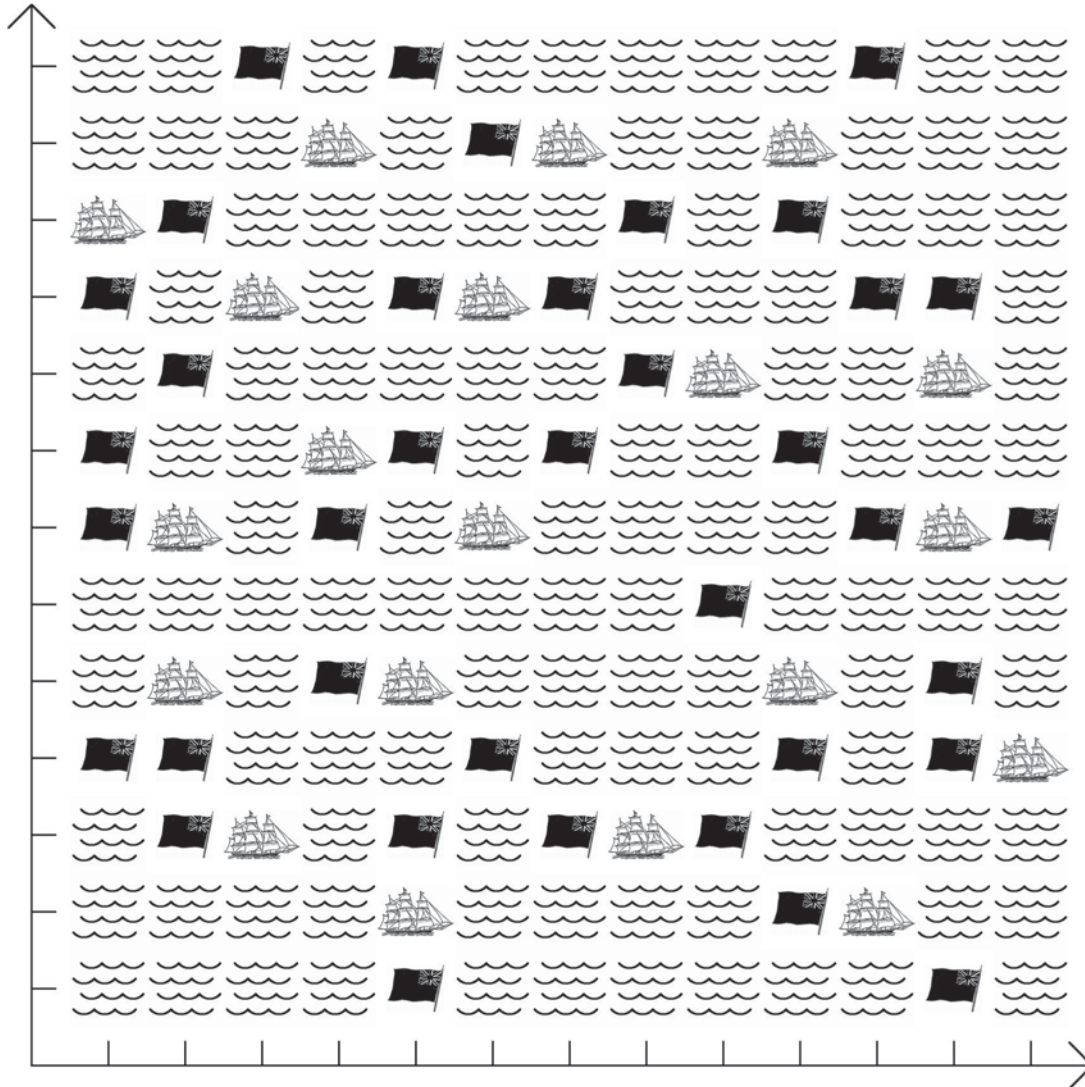


Dr. Ben Isaac Nary's Log - Art Room
