

To drum up more sales, the young entrepreneurs decide to run an advertising campaign. They hire Ricky Starell, the kid across the street.


Interesting kid, that Ricky. You wonder what he wants to be when he grows up. Perhaps he will:

Or maybe his dream job is in some other field entirely.




