That duck is not subtle. Discard the bottom card of your deck since you watched the duck put it there. Then take the new bottom card of your deck and put it on top of Duck's deck. This happens before Duck draws their card for the turn.

Meanwhile, let's do a softball trivia question. One of the contestants is already so close to the answer—they have 3/4 of the answer's letters correct. (Although it's written in the wrong slot. Sigh.)

Question 4: When you use the common name "bird," you are referring to what scientific class?

Okay, we're back to normal. Everyone's deck consists only of their own cards. Everything is normal and fine. The duck is even making friends with Rook, so perhaps the duck is actually on the level this time. Let's do an old chestnut of a bird trivia question.

Question 5: What is the collective noun for a group of owls?

It's time for Question 1. Read the following out loud to the other players:

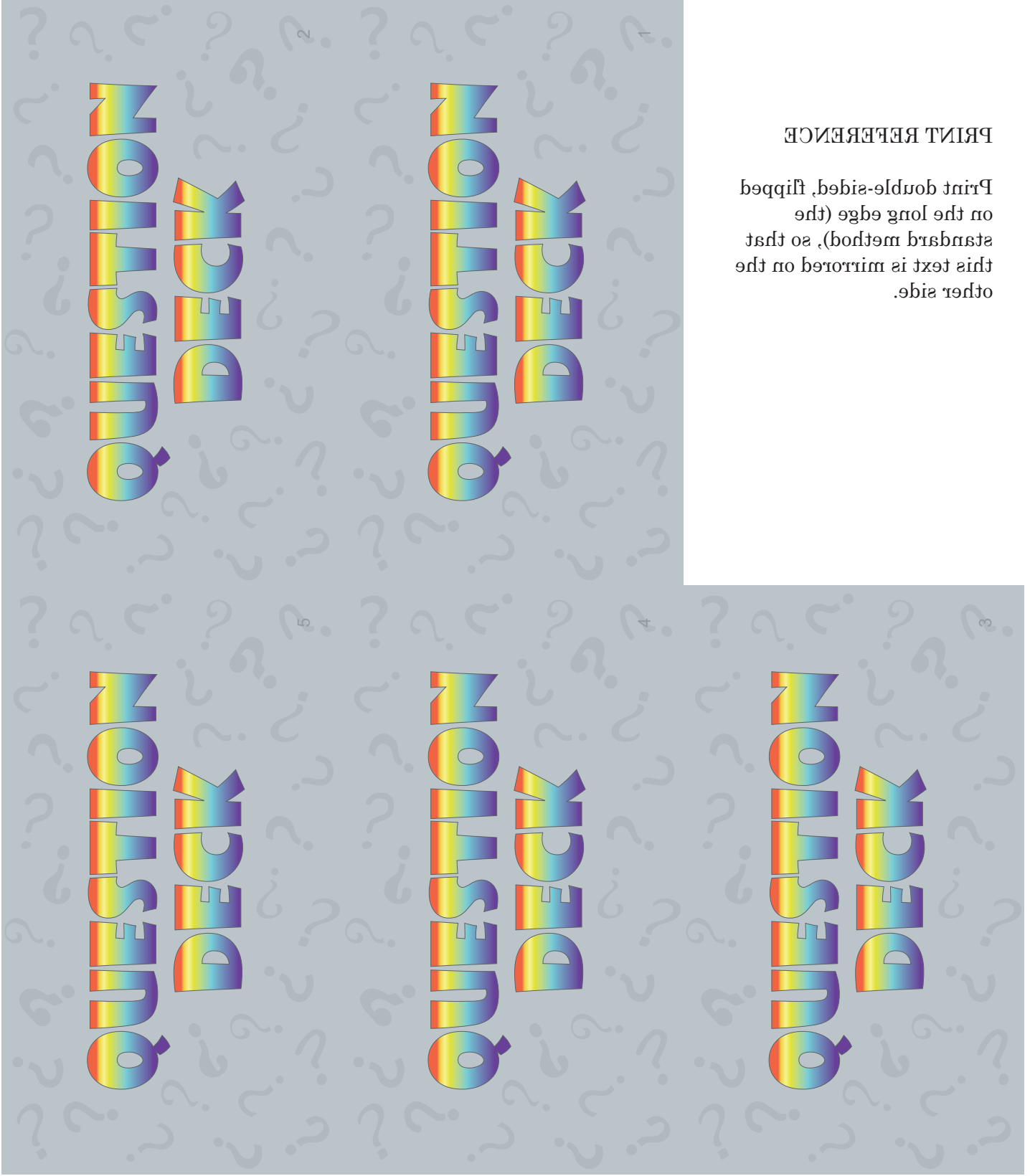
Uh, what? No one even came close to the correct answer. Maybe actual bird facts are not the way to go here? Let's try popular culture.

Okay, you're almost done. Here's the last question. No one's messed with your deck, no one's going to do anything major like reordering the rest of someone's cards, we're going to end with a nice, clean game.

Question 6: What is the name of the process by which birds clean their feathers with a specific insect?

None of these answers are anywhere close to right, and everyone is out of cards. The only reason you're handing out points right now is because you're forced to. For each question, find a bird that is described by the combination of the three contestants' answers, then assign them points based on the actual correct answer.

Question 1—The position of the first H in the answer.

Question 2—The position of the first A in the answer.

Question 3—The position of the first H in the answer.

Question 4—The position of the first V in the answer.

Question 5—The position of the first P in the answer.

Question 6—The position of the first I in the answer.

This isn't your first Duck Konundrum. You know that it's more important to understand where it's ending up than necessarily where it begins. Take the bottom card from your deck and follow its instructions.

That worked surprisingly well. However, these answers don't make any sense. Aren't they supposed to be birds? This is bird trivia right? Well, as the only person at this table with an actual bird, you should have an advantage here. Send the duck over to steal the bottom card of the Host's deck. Grab the card from the duck before anyone notices. Update your answers to the ones indicated on the card.

Remember, if you don't have a live duck, you will need to simulate the duck's actions with your rubber duck!

The duck seems to be moving right now. Once the duck has docked on a deck, encourage it to take the top card of that deck and bring it to you. Ducks love encouraging words. And bread. Read the card and follow the instructions on it, then draw your next card. (Obviously, the duck moves off the deck it's docked on when it comes to you.)

Oh. Rook's been solving chess problems? Man, glad you didn't get that deck. Well, there is one six-letter word that you can find word-search style on the grid. Maybe that is the correct one? That word looks familiar. Put it in #6.

The duck is getting bored. Once the duck has docked on a deck, it takes the top three cards and puts them on top of your deck in the original order, then reverses the rest of the other deck before resting in the middle of the table. Now go through the rest of the cards in your deck, in order, and follow the instructions.

It occurs to you—the Host is going to know if they're missing cards. Take your next card, flip it over, and give it to the duck. Tell the duck to go replace the card it stole with your card. Then, invite it to strut around the other contestants' decks after they draw their card for the turn. You see the duck rearrange their decks so that the bottom card is now on top. Oh that duck! Also, you're pretty sure the two birds on your paper are wrong, so erase them.

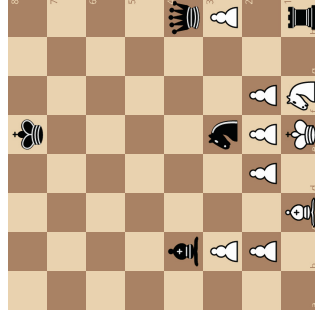
