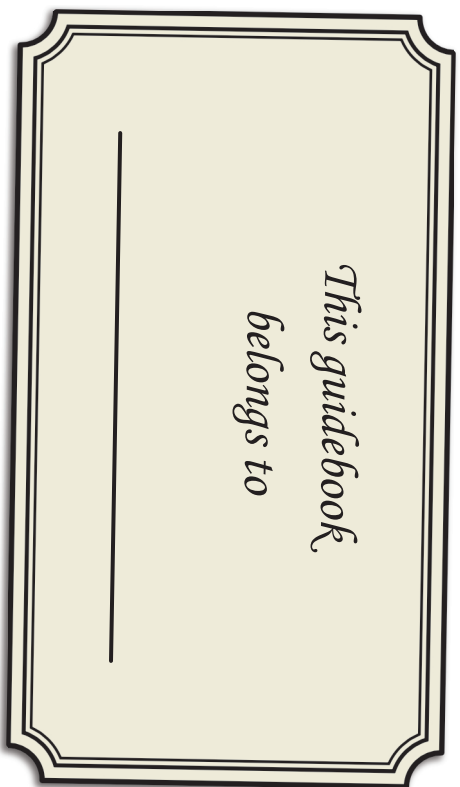

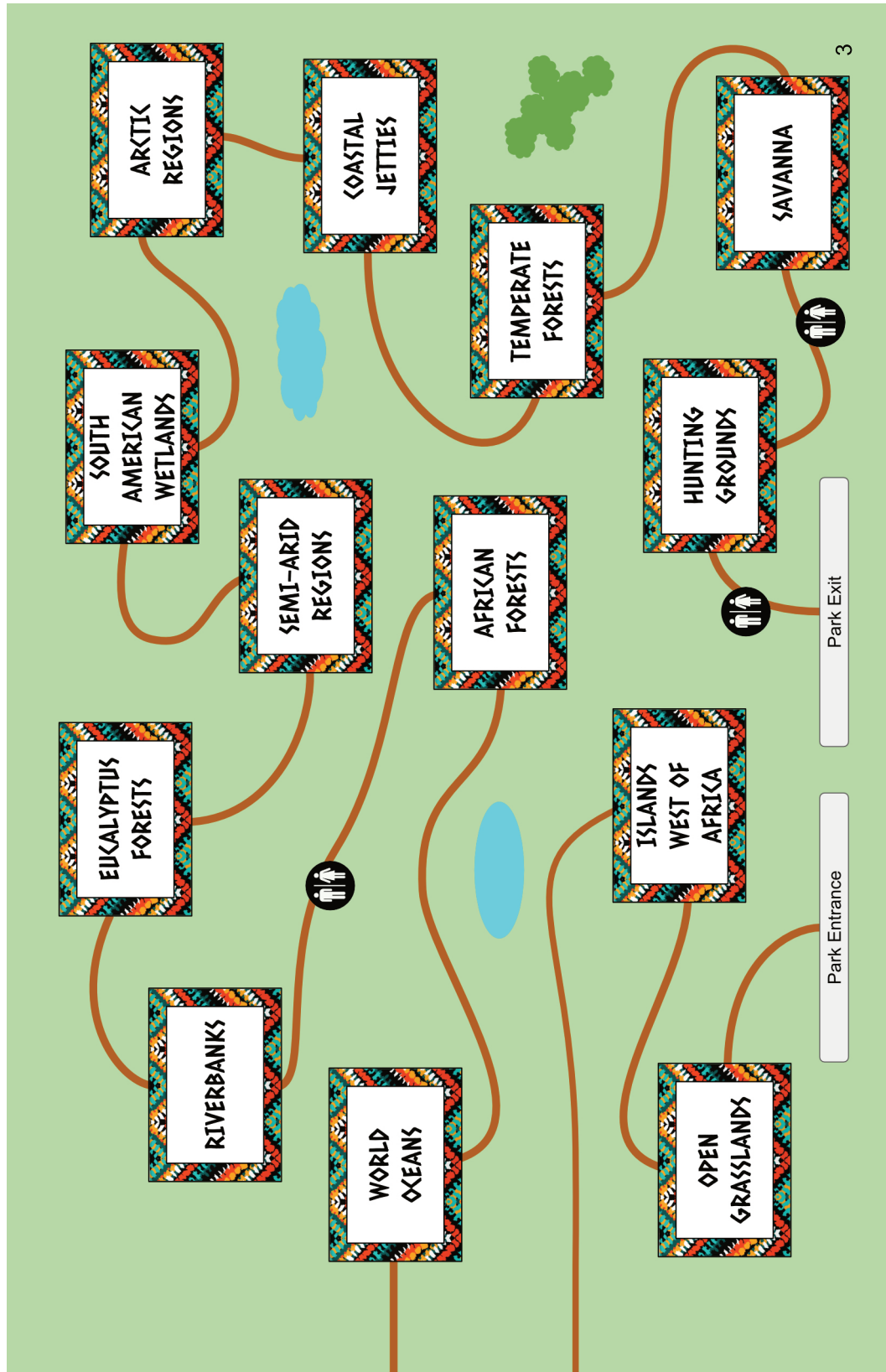

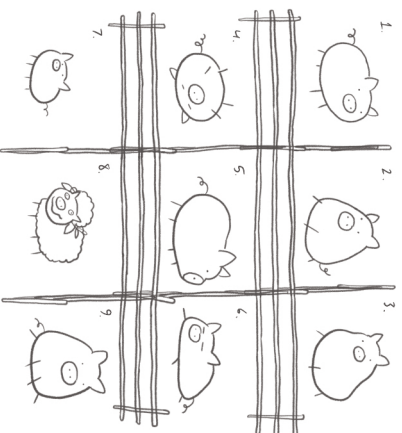
PARK MAP



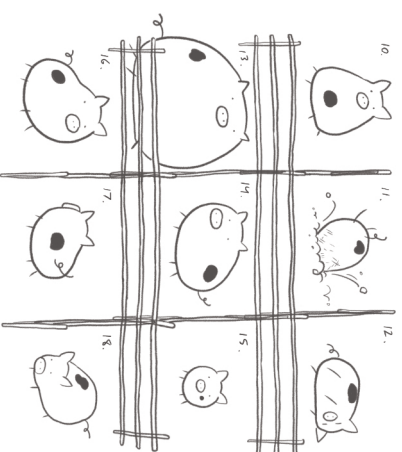

EAGLES

The Bewilderness is home to a convocation of eagles. They enjoy soaring on thermals above the park, and from high in the air our eagles can identify animals from A to Z. No one knows why, but they seem especially fond of the zebras.

Eagles are members of the class Aves, in the order Accipitriformes. They have four-chambered hearts and reproduce by laying eggs, which are incubated by both parents.



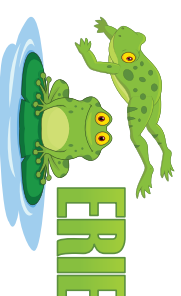
ANT COLONIES

LYNX

The lynx is an adept predator, at the top of the food chain in the regions it inhabits. It preys on a wide variety of animals, including the seven shown here.

Lynx are usually solitary, but sometimes hunt and travel together in a small group, referred to as a chain of lynx.

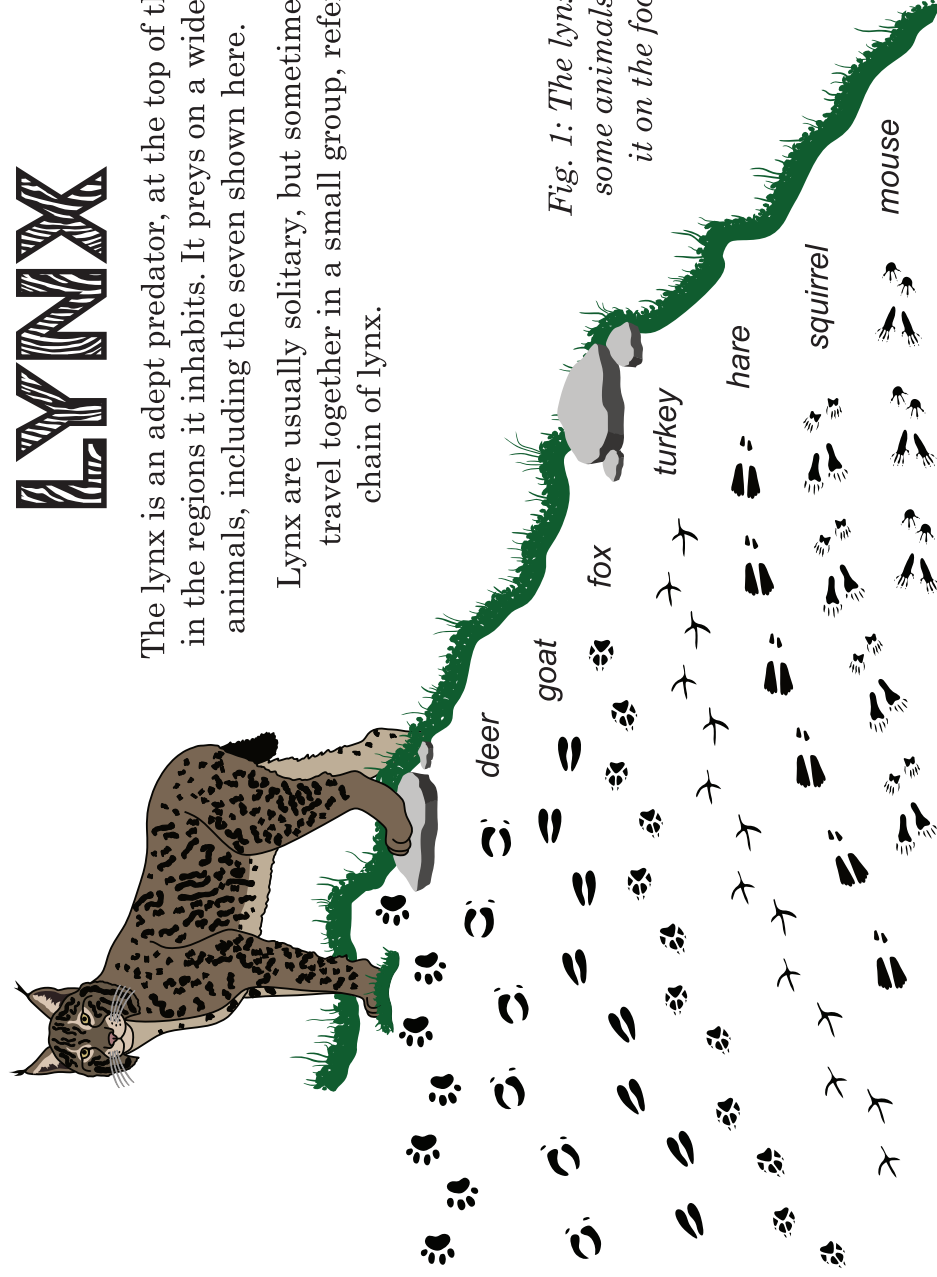
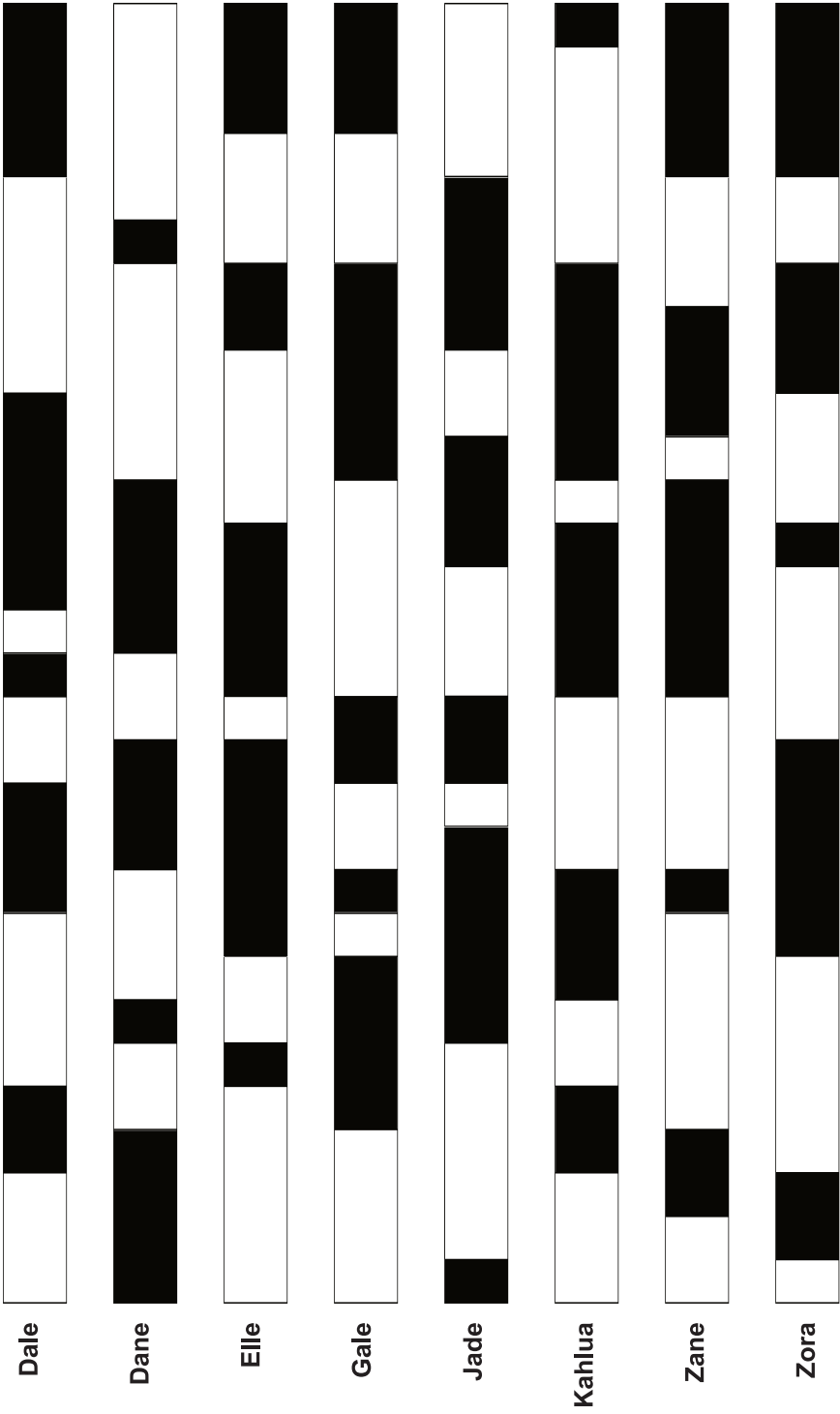



Fig. 1: The lynx and some animals below it on the food chain.
