CHAIN LETTERS

These protesters are going without **food**, **chaining** themselves together in a hunger strike.

You'll need to get some answers from the other three protesting groups before you can fill in the blanks for what's going on here, though.

You overhear one of the protesters say, "There's a problem with the links!"

You ask the nearest protester, "What's wrong? The links look strong enough to me."

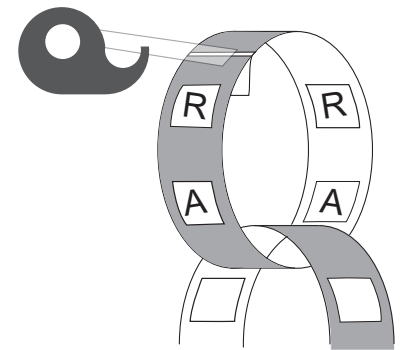
The Lynx page in the guidebook has the same animals that are shown in the backgrounds of the strips. Arrange the strips in order from lynx (on the left) to mouse (on the right), with the pre-printed letters right-side up. All strips should have their white margin at the bottom.

Write the answers from the other three groups of protesters in the blanks, across each row (i.e. first letter at the top of the lynx strip, second letter on deer, etc.). Each answer will span two rows. The given letters determine the order of the answers: **ACTIVIST ROAD HOGS**, **AUTOGRAPH HUNTERS**, **VOCAL ABNORMALITY**.

Cut apart the strips on the next page and put them in the correct order, then fill in the missing letters. Using tape, form a chain as shown to the right.

Be wary—this chained-up assembly might try to **spin** their story, so you'll have to **see that** the facts **line up**.

When things **come together**, we trust you to see both the **upsides** and **downsides** of their position.



What kind of people would disapprove of our wonderful park?

Make the chain as shown, with lynx on top (it is at the "top of the food chain"). Spin each link until the two letters on the shaded side match with the two letters on the inside. Be sure that your letters are right side up (or look at it from the other side!).

Where the links touch, read the printed letters visible on the over-side and the under-side in order from top down. You do not need to look between the links at the hand-written letters.

The result is: They are **HIPPIES**
